# Church Wide Study Friday, April 3, 2020

#### **Devotional Note**

During this difficult time we are all living, I believe God is attempting to get our attention, trying to teach us that it is not what we do for Him that matters but who we are in Him. It is not our strength and abilities He is interested in, but really our disposition and humility that matters most to him.

II Corinthians 12:7-10 says, "Therefore, in order to keep me from becoming conceited, I was given a thorn in the flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me. Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore, I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong."

Somewhere along the way, Paul learned a vital lesson: My weakness equals God's Strength. One commentator put it this way: "What is sent to torment Paul is transformed by God into a means of proclaiming Christ's power and grace. This surprising twist reflects the way God defeats Satan. God permits Satan to strike the apostle, but God turns the stricken Paul into an even greater instrument of his power. A proud, arrogant Paul would have only hindered the gospel's advance. A humiliated, frail Paul, led as a captive in God's triumph, has accelerated the gospel's progress so that the fragrance of knowing God spreads everywhere."

To borrow the commentator's words: "A proud, arrogant \_\_\_[my name]\_\_ would have only hindered the gospel's advance. A humiliated, frail \_\_\_\_[my name]\_\_\_ have accelerated the gospel's progress..."

That is why we can affirm that God isn't so much interested in our abilities; He's much more interested in our surrender. For it is our greatest difficulty that provides an opportunity for His greatest power to be revealed. So let us keep our eyes focused on Him as He guides us through this storm. "For He will deliver the needy who cry out, the afflicted who have no one to help. He will take pity on the weak and the needy and save the needy from death" (Psalm 72:12-13).
